Introduction and Overview of Social Impact

This report outlines the significant social impact generated by Vistry Partnership in collaboration with Fusion21 and housing partners, Plus Dane Housing.

This site is one of many Knowsley developments benefitting from Fusion21 and Knowsley Council's award-winning 'Social value through Planning' service; meaning major residential and industrial developments deliver positive outcomes for the people of Knowsley.

This site has generated a number of social value outcomes, leaving a legacy for Knowsley residents as well as local businesses and charities. Vistry Partnership have positively engaged in all aspects of social value delivery, led by Social Value Manager Julie Ferns.

The Social Value target for this site was 237 Social Value weeks. The total number of Social Value weeks delivered is **601**. Headline outcomes are as follows.

Case Study Supporting Next Generation Construction Professionals



Callum McLaughlin is learning on the job. He is worked as a Trainee Site Manager for <u>Countryside Partnerships</u>. His role takes on a wide range of responsibilities including safety checks, coordinating staff on site, making sure the correct materials for the day's work are available, and inspecting work for snags – and he's doing it all as an apprentice.

Callum, 23 and from Huyton, began his construction site supervisor apprenticeship (level 4) in Autumn 2021.

He used Knowsley Council's dedicated online portal, <u>The Knowsley Apprentice</u>, to look for new jobs and applied for the role he now has.

He said: "I'd recommend the apprenticeship route to anyone. I hadn't heard of this type of apprenticeship before but thought it offered everything I was looking for, and was lucky enough to get an interview and get the job. I really enjoy it and I've learned a lot about being on site and how everything works.

"Countryside is a good company to work for, they look after their team and I look forward to getting qualified and progressing my career here. I've also completed my SMSTS and I am continuing my employment once this development is finished and will be gaining further experience on one of Countryside's housing developments."

I feel being at the event helped me to engage with the residents giving them a face and name to associate with the local build, it also gave them an understanding that we are interested in their needs

and what happens within the community. Giving out food parcels as prizes was a simple way to engage in a positive friendly manor allowing them to speak to me should they have any concerns with the house building or the site as a whole".
